Summary

This session discussed the Joint Program on Waste Monitoring and Capacity Development, the Development Approach, Pilot Test Methodologies, UN Roles in the African Clean Cities Platform and Implementation Perspectives by TICAD 7 in 2019. The overall objective of the Joint Waste Monitoring and Capacity Development Program is to accelerate the achievement of the SDG objectives in the sector of solid waste management.

The methodologies development and pilot approach consist of developing indicator methodologies, convening an international and multisectoral expert group to discuss major issues, etc. Roles of UN in the African Clean Cities Platform relate to monitoring of SDGs, capacity development, guidance in policy formulation and legislation, etc.
